A number of techniques has been acquired by Golovenkina during her many years of artistic practice as a watercolor artist. She is currently working with various media including natural materials and ceramics.

She utilizes various media in order to explore mind-body connection, vulnerability, and psychological injuries. Combining existential therapy and psychoanalytic methods, Golovenkina invites her viewers to look deep within themselves.

Touch series

Sea creatures live in a kind of tactile deprivation. Getting in contact with them is possible but very unlikely to be an enjoyable experience for both sides.

Dreams and visions are a very intimate and delicate substance. In this series Valeria Golovenkina draws on ideas of the humanistic approach to psychology, inviting the viewer to ponder on accepting their own innermost feelings. The artist speculates on the effects that emotions might have on physical motion through the metaphor of furry marine creatures. Admitting the tenderness down deep inside of you and embracing your dark side, one becomes free, feels more life, achieve greater heights.

Having been inspired by natural forms, human can borrow their best qualities and utilise them in his technical achievements. At the same time, the distinctive features of the animal world can lead the viewer to a number of interesting associations and provide food for introspection.

Working with transformative properties of the material, Valeria invites the viewer to immerse themselves in sensations and being taken through new experience.

Exploring the duality of personality, the artist relies on the psychoanalysis approach and turns to the human body, the way it encodes messages and expresses hidden motives. For Valeria Golovenkina it is important to encourage the viewer to notice their own associations and feelings, to be in touch with them and get to know them better.

The project is intended to explore hidden emotions, specifically those not considered socially acceptable. Coming from a family whose generations had been typically raised with traditions of Soviet-era thinking, she suffered mental pressure from those around her, truly believing that a certain range of her emotions had to be viewed as shameful. Golovenkina emphasizes the importance of having an accepting attitude and embracing one's own feelings in order to avoid the negative impact on overall mental health.

In the Black'n'White series, I reflect on the representation of black and white. Society has labeled black as a symbol of darkness and evil, and white as a symbol of purity, correctness and goodness, and encourages striving from the former to the latter.

I argue that unawareness is the real darkness. This is an attempt to unveil only one's "bright" side to the world, with denying and silencing their shortcomings, an attempt to destroy the "evil" in themselves. But there is no light without a shadow.

Black is just black.

Become yourself, not the best version of yourself.

Moving

series 2023

The word "moving" means both «able to move« and «touching, emotional». The artist combines these two meanings in her series of watercolor on cardboard. The choice of medium is a challenge to the rules and a means of conveying the inner turmoil and grief about her childhood and naivety in connection with an urgent relocation.

The subjects of paintings are landscapes and floral motifs, among which Valeria grew up. The abstract paint drips and understatement refer either to scraps of a night dream or to fervent desires.


